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NIH Music and Health grant proposal


iQsonics joined forces with CHOC-TAC (Children's Hospital of Orange County, Thompson Autism Center), UCLA CART (Center for Autism Research and Treatment) and Cal State Fullerton, submitting a grant proposal to NIH initiative Promoting Research on Music and Health: Phased Innovation Award for Music Interventions (R61/R33 Clinical Trial Optional). If funded, the 5-year research study will begin in July 2022, and include a clinical trial of SS4Kids with 200 children with autism, with training for their parents and caregivers to effectively play the program at home with their children, and receive support from the SS4Kids Community of Practice of peers, professionals, administrators and subject matter experts. (This proposal replaces the previous submitted for NIH SBIR Phase 2 funding.)

Based on the research results from Dept. of Education SBIR funded study, the article <u>"Effect of Sing and Speak 4 Kids: An</u> <u>Online Music-Based Speech and Language Learning Game</u> for Children in Early Intervention" was published in Child Language Teaching & Therapy international peer-reviewed journal. Authored by Dr. Hayoung Lim, ORU Music Therapy Clinic, Dr. Erica Ellis, Cal State Los Angeles Communication Disorders Dept., and David Sonnenschein, acceptance in this professional journal helps establish SS4Kids as an evidencebased practice for clinical and educational institutions around the world.

Marketing, Outreach and Social Media



Intellectual Property Protection



To protect the IP of the company from marketplace competitors with education and health related technologies, and invest in the potential licensing opportunities to third parties that could valuate our assets in the future, iQsonics filed in 2020 for a Provisional Patent of the design invention of Sing and Speak 4 Kids with patent attorney JD Harriman of Foundation Law Group LLP. This year, the complete filing of the **Utility Patent** was completed. In addition, a **U.S. Copyright** was filed in 2020 for the music composition and performance, and the computer code for the SS4Kids program.

Small Business Administration Loan



Based on 2019 revenues, iQsonics qualified and received an **Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL)** from SBA of \$66,000. Due to the COVID pandemic, SBA extended the start date to mid-2022 for beginning monthly loan payments.
